Conservation of the Travelchest.

In 2015 restauration students of Tartu Art College conservated a travelchest which belongs to Estonian Road Museum.

The travelchest was in a very bad condition. Leather was dirty and brittle, with tears, crackes and losses. Textile lining was dirty, with spots and holes. Metal details and nails were rusted. Wood constructions were partially deformated.

The travelchest was cleaned in dry method. A dust and insects excrements were removed useing soft brushes and vacuum cleaner. Rusted and deformated nails were removed too. Cleaned leather surface was treated at first with ammoonium hydrate water solution and after that with distillated water. Textile details were removed, washed and repared. Delikate places were dublicated with Reemay. After that detiles were glued back on their places. A big crack under the bottom of the chest was repeared with wooden wedges. Small holes were filled. The filler contained with PVA glue, chalk and fine sawdust. Metals was cleaned and treated against the rust. Broken nails were replaced with new nails. Leather was repared useing leather and coloured japanese paper paches. Tears were confirmed and the surface of the leather was treated with KlucelG solution.
